Part 1: Creating a Free Response Question

Think back to the Free-Response Questions that I have given you in Chapter 7 ↓

- Cubs
- Softball team

With your groups:

1. Set up a scenario
2. Create 2 (minimum) matrices. Remember, these matrices were often presented as a table.
3. Create and answer 3 questions

Requirements:

- Problems and solutions must be typed on separate pages.
 - Scenario must be realistic
 - FRQ must be emailed to me and shared with me by **December 11, 2016 @ midnight**.
 - A printed version of the FRQ must be submitted to me by **December 13, 2016**.
 - Each group must present their scenario. During presentations, each group member must speak.
 - Students must be good and active listeners. Therefore, by the end of **all** presentations, students must suggest at least 2 other questions.

Part 2: Completing Free Response Questions
